

Introductory Note

The Glossary for the 1987 LFS has been produced in four sections, plus appendices.

1. The first section is all of the basic items in Record Type order, which is the order the items appear on a computer file. The Glossary items are page numbered and an alphabetical index is also supplied. Most of these items also show the Questionnaire number which has been added above the item name in the top right hand corner of the page. The prefix of E, A or B relates to the relevant LFS questionnaire.
2. The second section consists of derived items on the Main UK file, grouped into Household, Family and Person categories, which is how the items appear on the computer database. The Glossary items are page numbered. An alphabetical index is also supplied.
3. The third section consists of derived items on the SOEC file in the order in which they appear on that file, which is the order the items appear on a computer file. The Glossary items are also page numbered. The SOEC column number has also been added beneath the item name in the top right corner of each page. An alphabetical index is also supplied.
4. The fourth section consists of additional items included on the Scottish Extract file, with an index. These items are shown in the same order as they appear on the computer database, which is the order they appear on the Scottish C/D Questionnaire.

There are also three Appendices A, B and C which cover details of Occupation, Subject of Higher Qualification and Industry

NA (No answer) and DNA (Does not apply) codes

The codes for NA and DNA have been left blank on many items because the actual values are dependent on the tabulation system which is being used. OPCS generated TAU files use M1 for does not apply (NA) and M2 for not applicable (NA). Most other files (eg for SPSS) use -9 for DNA and -8 for NA.
