Dear Interviewer,

Thank you for attending the CHS 1987 Briefing session on Tuesday 16 December; I hope you found it an interesting and useful day. As a result of discussions at this and at the subsequent Briefing we have made some changes to the CHS 1987 Questionnaire, and this letter provides details of these. Replacement pages are enclosed for you to bring your Interviewer Instructions up to date.

Household Schedule

Q1 (page 2). We have added a code for the type of dwelling best described as a "rural cottage", ie an old, small property in the country, usually with only a single story

Q15(A)-(F) (Fuel grid) (page 9). We have attempted to differentiate between the Calor gas cylinders used for heating and those used for cooking by putting these on separate lines Please read the new instructions regarding this on page (8) under Q15(A), paragraphs (b) and (c) Pleae also note the instructions at paragraph (a) to disregard the rental cost of the LPG gas storage tank when recording the cost of the last purchase.

Q17(B) (page 11) We have decided the the option 'town gas' (code 2) for a new cooker is acceptable

Q2O (page 12). In the Household Theft section, enquiries have revealed that break-ins and thefts from garages, sheds, &c, are to be included along with burglaries from the actual residence; the instructions on page (12) have been ammended to reflect this.

Q21 (page 13). Note that the vandalism referred to here includes damage to exterior wall, garages, &c; again, please refer to the instructions

Individual Schedule

Education section

Please note that this section is only asked of those aged 16-69 inclusive; those aged 70 and over go on to the Employment section

Q1 (page 5) There was some discussion about to what the phrase 'left school' actually referred The position we have chosen to adopt is now fully detailed in the instructions referring to Q1 on page (5). Briefly, the age we wish to record is that at which the informant left secondary/grammar school, any form of subsequent education, eg at FE or Technical college, is not counted.

Q6(B) (pages 12-13). As suggested at the Briefing, we have relocated Q6(B) from the bottom of page 12 to the bottom of page 13. You may use the large empty space remaining at the bottom of page 12 for any notes or comments on the Language questions

Employment section

We thought long and hard about a possible problem with this section which was raised in the discussions at Thursday's Briefing, in that in some cases the full details of elderly people's "lifetime" job may not be recorded. We decided, however, that to make the required major changes to the Questionnnaire at such a late date would not be possible, and that therefore we are going to have to live with the fact that we will be missing some information in what will we hope be relatively few cases.

At Thursday's Briefing there was also confusion about the questions referring to 'number of employees working in the establishment' (Q3(A)(1), page 15; Q4(B)(1), page 16, Q25(A)(1), page 22, Q26(B)(1), page 23, Q30(A)(1), page 25). We feel that the interpretation of 'establishment' should be left up to the informant This information is of greatest relevence for managers and foremen/supervisors, as it should give an indication of the number of other employees over whom they have control, thus 'establishment' would normally refer to a single site, eg a school or a bank branch, say

Q6(B) (page 17) We have changed the wording slightly to remove the reference to self-employed informants doing "overtime", as this was thought to be inappropriate.

Q12(A) (page 19). Please note a new question here, asking for number of job starts in the last 12 months.

Family Information section

Checks A-D (page 38) Checks A and B have been extended, so that you can record the action you took regarding the self-completion form. The instructions on page (38b) have been changed in the light of this.

Police section

Q1 (page 41). The instructions for this question have been clarified and extended; see especially page (41)

CHS INTERVIEVER INSTRUCTIONS 1987

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PART 1 GENERAL NOTES ON BACKGROUND AND PROCEDURES

1. Background and Purpose of the Survey

There is a vital need for regular and related information about people and their families so that Government can be sure that the services it provides match the needs of the community as closely as possible.

The Continuous Household Survey (CHS) is designed for this purpose. It provides Government departments with continuing information about the major social fields of Population, Housing, Employment, Education and Health Because all the topics are covered in one survey, it is possible to examine not only each topic separately but also the effect of each upon the other (eg the effect of housing conditions upon health).

CHS is unique in providing information about a number of social fields and their inter-relationship; although departments produce their own information and commission their own studies they do so in isolation, and one department's figures are not easily related to another's Furthermore, they tend to collect information about the services they provide, but little about the nature of the people who use them. Censuses collect limited information and are only carried out every ten years - too infrequent and too little for the purposes of social policy and day-to-day decisions.

The topics mentioned above form the Core Material which remains from year to year, although the detailed questioning may change over time. In addition, new topics that would not warrant a survey in their own right can be included for limited periods of time, usually a year

After analysis summaries of CHS data are normally made public in the form of an annual Report and occasional CHS Monitors. The information these publications contain is available to all; copies of the publications can be obtained from Public Libraries, and certain topics, such as housing, employment and smoking, receive frequent coverage in the media.

2 The Sample

Each year approximately 4500 addresses are selected randomly from the Rating Valuation Lists. At each address we wish to interview all memoers of the household aged 16 years and over.

The fieldwork is spread throughout the year to make sure that the sample is representative of all times of the year, thus we can measure, for example, sickness due to epidemics, seasonal change in unemployment, &c

3 Address List

- (a) This is a sample of <u>addresses</u> Surnames are given simply as an aid to your first contact with the household and as a guide to the correct <u>address</u>. If the people shown on your list ha e moved. interview whomsoever is living at the address now Wherever possible, do not use names - CHS is an Address Survey.
- (b) Remember to contact the local RUC Station to inform them that you are working on behalf of a number of Government departments and will be calling on addresses in the area over a period of time.

4. General Rules

- (a) Visit every address on the list. Addresses should not necessarily be interviewed in the order given on the quota sheet but grouped for economy.
- (b) If you are unable to find the address listed do <u>not</u> substitute another address but refer to Headquarters immediately on the calls and outcome sheet provided.
- (c) Always show your Authority Card to the informant.
- (d) Always state that co-operation is voluntary and stress that all information is confidential.
- (e) Give an explanation of the Survey and how the address came to be selected.
- (f) Do not interview on the doorstep.
- (g) Record all answers at the time of conducting the interview and <u>check</u> the completed questionnaire before returning it to Headquarters.
- (h) Leave a CHS Purpose Leaflet at all addresses visited including refusals. Do not use the Leaflet as a means of introducing the survey - leave it at the end of the interview.
- (i) The quota of addresses should be interviewed evenly over the month in which they have been allocated. <u>Ensure</u> that progress sheets are completed weekly and returned to arrive at Headquarters every Monday.
- (j) Complete a calls and outcome sheet for every address/household on the list.
- (k) Notify Headquarters immediately if there is a delay in the fieldwork.
- (1) When recording numbers, fill up all the boxes by inserting leading zeroes when applicable, eg where a 2 digit box has been provided record 2 as 02:

Do not leave a blank or insert a dash.

(m) If in any doubt, ring Headquarters - (0232) 63210, ext 2527 or 2146.

5. The Interview Schedules

There are 3 different schedules for field use.

1. Household Schedule (yellow)

This covers household composition, the main features of the accommodation, tenure, household amenities, heating and fuel costs, and housing costs. One Household Schedule is completed for each household at which interviewing takes place.

2. Individual Schedule (white)

This covers several different topics relating to an individual within the household. One schedule should be completed for each person aged 16 and over in the household.

(2)

3. Proxy Schedule (pink)

For non-contacts.

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6. Eligibility of Addresses

- (a) We are interested only in private households; thus any address which is not a private residence, whether in whole or in part, should be disregarded:-BUT NOTE
 - (1) A house or flat with a shop is a private residence
 - (2) If the address is a school or business premises (eg offices) there may be a resident caretaker; if so, interview the caretaker's household.
 - (3) Interview the owner/proprietor of a guesthouse/private hotel if the owner/proprietor runs it and lives on the premises.

EXCLUDE

- (1) hostels,
- (2) institutions, eg schools, hospitals (but see (2) above),
- (3) business premises (but see (2) above),
- (4) hotels (but see (3) above),
- (5) demolished houses,
- (6) derelict and empty houses.

Return all ineligible addresses to Headquarters immediately, fully detailing the reasons for reaching your decision.

- (b) If when you have located the address you find that the accommodation has been divided up into separate self-contained units (eg a large house divided into separate self-contained flats), then select and interview households as follows:-
 - (1) If there are only 2 units, then interview both.
 - (2) If there are 2 to 6 units, then interview the second only.
 - (3) If there are 7 or more units, then interview the seventh only.
- <u>NB</u> Treat each case as a separate household (see household definition), noting the proper address together with an explanation on the calls and outcome sheet.

7 Household Definition

(a) Once you have established an eligible address and made contact it is important to establish the household who live at that address

A household is defined as a single person or group of people who have the address as their MAIN or only address and who either -

(1) Share one meal a day. (This does not necessarily imply that they must always sit down to eat together, but can be that the food is bought or provided on a common basis)

OR

(2) Share living accommodation:

- (i) accommodation may still be regarded as shared where the address does not have an actual living room which is separate from the kitchen (ie where the main living room forms part of the same room as the kitchen);
- (ii) a household can be treated as one if the living room is also used as a bedroom;
- (iii) never regard as one household solely on the basis of a shared kitchen and/or bathroom.
- (b) Multihouseholds (not to be confused with 6(b)) are best defined as a group of people who reside at a dwelling but do not share living accommodation or food/eating arrangements.
- NB If you establish that there is more than one household at an address you must make separate arrangements to interview each household and obtain a household schedule for each.
- 8. Eligibility of Individuals
- (a) Establishing residence

The first job is to find out who is to be treated as resident at the address for the purposes of the Survey. The majority of individuals will have only one address and will be included without question. Anyone with more than one address should be included at the address they regard as their MAIN one. However, the following special rules take priority and should be applied in all cases.

(1) Adults (ie persons aged 16 and over) who live away from home for the purposes of either work or study and come home only for holidays or weekends should NOT be included at their parental address.

Under this rule you should exclude students away at college or boarding school during term-time and those working away from home on a permanent basis - even if they are at home at the time of the interview.

Children working away from home in a <u>temporary</u> job (but see (2)) should be included in the parental household, as should children under 16 at boarding/special schools.

(2) Anyone who has been away from the address <u>continuously</u> for 6 months or more should be excluded.

Under this rule, exclude anyone who has been in hospital or prison for 6 months or more, members of the forces on long tours of duty, children who have been in care for an extended period and people who have worked away from home for 6 or more months.

(3) Include visitors if they have been at the address for <u>at least 12 months</u> even if they have a residence elsewhere.

In the case of newcomers, eg married children, mother-in-law, etc, if they have moved into the household and regard it as their MAIN residence now, then include them.

In all other cases the question of whether or not the address is the main residence should be decided by the respondent.

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(b) Non-contacts

A non-contact is a person aged 16 or over who resides at the address but cannot be contacted or interviewed because of:

- (1) illness or senility (but see 9(a) below);
- (2) being away temporarily for the period of the fieldwork (holiday, temporary job, etc) (but see 9(a) below);
- (3) "language barrier" (eg Chinese) or mental condition.
- NB Do not treat anyone who refuses to co-operate as a non-contact.

9. Proxies

A Proxy interview schedule should be attempted for any individual who cannot be contacted, BUT NOT for a refuser. Proxies should be attempted:

- (a) where the informant is senile, mentally backward or totally deaf;
- (b) where the informant is ill and will not be well enough to see you before the end of the field period;
- (c) where the informant is away for the field work period, eg in hospital, on holiday or away working;
- <u>NB</u> If you are told that the person is "never in", you should still recall three times in the hope of seeing the informant in person before resorting to a Proxy interview.
- (d) where an informant is "too busy" or "not interested in that kind of thing" (as is often said of husbands by their wives). You should always recall if possible to try to explain to the informant in person before resorting to a Proxy interview.

Remember the Proxy schedule (pink) is a much shorter version of the main one, and in the case of (d) particularly a Proxy interview is the <u>last resort</u>; it it is better than nothing, but that is all.

There may be other circumstances where it is possible to take a Proxy, but ring Headquarters for a ruling first. In all cases where a Proxy is taken we need a full description on the Calls and Outcome as to why it was necessary.

Permission

Wherever possible it is advisable to ask the informant before you do a Proxy on them. A Proxy is best taken from a close relative, but you should use your judgement, bearing public relations in mind If you are in any doubt, ring Headquarters

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PART 2 THE QUESTIONNAIRES

An important feature of the CHS is that it can respond to the changing requirements of Government departments; with this in mind we are including new questions and new sections for 1987. Some questions and sections currently in the Survey will not be included in 1987. The main changes are as follows:

General Points on Presentation

The instruction pages are interleaved with the Questionnaire so that where possible the instructions face the relevant question.

Each page of instructions has the same page number in brackets as the relevant Questionnaire page.

There there are two or more pages of instructions for one Questionnaire page the instruction pages are denoted as (a), (b), (c), &c. Thus instruction pages (1a) and (1b) both relate to Questionnaire page 1.

Proxy Schedule

The Proxy Schedule is a shortened version of the Individual Schedule. For 1987 it contains the following Sections:

Employment Education Health

The same instructions apply as for the Individual Schedule questions.

GENERAL

Collecting Household information

When asking for household composition you should always begin by asking who normally lives in the accommodation. This should lead you to be told of any individuals who are not always present, and you will then be able to establish whether or not they should be treated as resident. In all cases of possible doubt you should also check whether or not meals or living accommodation are shared; you should always check this where the household is anything other than husband and wife and children aged under 16.

The Household Schedule should always be completed as the first step at any address, and one Household Schedule must be completed for every fully or partially co-operating household.

The information on the Household Schedule should be obtained from the person(s) most likely to know the correct answers. This will usually be the Head of Household or his/her spouse

Boxes

Where a box is designed for more than 1 digit, this has been indicated on the Schedule by short vertical lines; please space out the numbers accordingly. In boxes designed for 2 digits, codes 1-9 should be entered as 01, 02, &c.

Front Page

H/H ID No.	Transfer the Household Identification Number into the 4 boxes provided
Total Number of Households at address	Enter the total number of households at the address, eg 01, 02 03, &c.
Household Number	Enter the number of the particular household being interviewed at the address. If there is only one household at the address enter 1, second, third, etc households should be numbered 2, 3, &c.
District Council	Transfer the Distrist Council Number into the appropriate boxes (all DCs in NI have a unique number).
Electoral Ward	Transfer the Electoral Ward Number from the quota sheet into the appropriate boxes

- (b) Finishing date. the date you completed the last Individual/Proxy Schedule(s).
- <u>NB</u> In some cases these dates will be the same. If there is 7 days or more between the two dates an explanation is required, and this should be attached to the Schedule.

Resident at address

Include as resident at that address:

- (a) people away on holiday, away on business or in hospital, UNLESS they have been living away from the address continuously for 6 months or more;
- (b) children aged under 16 including those away at boarding or other schools.

EXCLUDE

- (a) individuals whose <u>MAIN</u> address or residence is elsewhere eg temporary visitors, some types of lodger;
- (b) individuals who have been away from this address for 6 months or more;
- (c) children aged 16 or over who are away during term time at boarding or other school, college or university - even if they are home on holiday;
- (d) addresses used as second homes.

Fill in the Relationship to HoH column by starting with the Head of Household.

Head of The HoH must by definition be a member of the household, and Household (HoH) is the person who owns the household accommodation OR is legally responsible for the rent OR has the responsibility for the accommodation.

> If none of the above apply (eg a separated woman or joint owners), the HoH is the person whom the adults agree to be the HoH. Generally it is the husband, or the elder of 2 persons of the same sex.

> In the case of a single person sharing (eg students, unmarried employees, etc), it is the person who is legally responsible for the accommodation/rent/contract/etc.

Listing members After entering in the HoH all other members are listed in descending order of age within the family unit, so that the next person will usually be the spouse of the HoH followed by the children (in order of age), followed by any other members in family unit order. Clearly state their relationship to the HoH, eg "wife", "daughter", "grandchild", "son-in-law", etc.

> In the case of a 2 family situation, eg a married daughter living at home, you should in addition write in the relationship to the second family, eg "daughter - wife of 04" or "grandson - son of 03".

<u>ALWAYS</u> ring the person number in the first column - this is the sole identification of everyone in the survey.

It is only at the stage of listing persons that you can really decide if the address houses more than one household. If it does you must cross out the members of the second household (as the Household Schedule and its related Individual Schedules refer only to one household) and transfer them to their own set of Schedules (see Household Definition, page 3).

In most cases there will only be one household at the address. f 13

Details of For each person number, whether present or absent, record household their relationship to the HoH and their sex.

Record Age in years as 2 digits (less than 1 = 01).

Marital Status - the definition of married is what the persons themselves define as married.

Family unit Figures collected by a number of Government departments relate to families rather than to households. Consequently it is necessary to group household members into family units.

A FAMILY UNIT can consist of:

- a single person;
- a married couple on their own;
- a married couple/lone parent and their never-married children, provided these children have no children of their own;
- one parent only, eg a divorced daughter without children.

Generally it is the nuclear family.

A brother and sister whose parents are not part of the household would form two separate family units.

Members of the HoH's family unit should be numbered as 1, the next family unit as 2 and so on, eg:

- (a) In general family units cannot span more than two generations, is grandparents and grandchildren cannot belong to the same family unit. The exception to this is where it is established that the grandparents are responsible for looking after the grandparent(eg while parents are abroad)
- (b) Adopted and step-children have the same family unit number as their adoptive/step-parents. Foster-children should be given a family unit number separate from that of the foster-parents.

Current Full- time education	It is current education that is wanted. If a person has finished <u>full-time</u> education, nothing is coded even if they are doing a part-time course, Open University, etc.
	"Other HE" refers to any full-time higher education not covered by university, polytechic or technical college, eg secretarial college.
Age finished full-time	Again it is <u>full-time</u> education not part-time, and it is the actual age at which the informant left college.
education	There should be something in this box for everyone for which "Current F/T Education" is blank (excluding pre-school children).
Level of co-operation	Each person is coded as to their degree of co-operation; this can be done only after all Individual Schedules have been completed.
	<pre>F = full response - all sections P = partial response - some sections refused R = complete refusal N = non-contact - no Proxy NP = non-contact - Proxy Sxchedule completed.</pre>
Total Persons in Household	Enter the total number of persons in this particular household (= last Person Number ringed).
Total Adults in Household	Enter the total number of persons in this particular household who are aged 16 or over - this gives you the number to interview individually.
Total Persons Interviewed	This is the total of Full or Partial interviews - <u>not</u> Proxies.

Purpose of Section

To carry out effective housing policies the Department of the Environment needs to be able to assess the extent and nature of the housing problem in different parts of the country. These questions are designed to provide information for this purpose. They are concerned with those housing factors that are important for gauging certain basic housing standards, such as degree of overcrowding and the amount of accommodation that lacks sole use of certain standard amenities. In addition CHS looks at respondents' level of satisfaction with their housing and monitors the growth in possession of consumer durables and central heating.

- Q1 This question <u>must</u> be completed for <u>all</u> addresses; you should code from observation. Code 4 refers to terraced houses and terraced bungalows; code 8 refers to any other type of housing including those prefabricated houses erected after the war to cope with housing shortages.
- Q2 If the informant does not know when the building was constructed probe for an estimate. If this is unsuccessful, estimate it yourself - as always with an estimate, ring the code E. Only use the code -1 as a last resort.
- Q3 We want to know how long the HoH has lived at this address, in the particular house or flat not just the area. Enter the number of completed years at the address; under 1 year should be coded as 01. Absences from the address which are temporary, ie without permanent intent, should be ignored.
- Q4 A fixed bath/shower is one which is permanently attached to a water supply and has a wastepipe. Ask whether the HoH has these amenities or not, and then whether or not they are shared.
- Q4(A) We want the rooms that the household has the use of, ie not including rooms that are sublet or rented.

Bedrooms - we require whatever the informant thinks of as a bedroom. Every household should have at least one, ie a room in which someone sleeps. Spare bedrooms and bedsitting rooms are included. Kitchen - this is a room for cooking separate from the living room. In many old cottages the cooking is done on a range, with the main living room being in a porch or hallway - these are not kitchens. Kitchen includes sculleries. Other rooms - you may have to prompt for such things as boxrooms, studies, laundry rooms, etc. Add up the total number of rooms and record the total at Q4(B), having checked it with the respondent and resolved any discrepancy. Alcoves and halls are not separate rooms. If in any doubt whether to include or exclude a room give a full dependent of formation.

description, eg:-Attic, loft, store room - specify whether (a) it vas built/converted for living purposes; or (b) it has a skylight or vindow. Sunroom, extension - note whether it can be used all year round or only in summer. Open-plan - count dining area as a separate room if it can be divided off by a partition or folding screen.

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Purpose of Section

The CHS is able to monitor both the public and private housing sectors and the movement from one to another. The present Government is encouraging more people to become owner-occupiers, and the present policy of selling local authority houses to tenants has to be looked at by assessing how seriously people in the rented sector have considered buying their homes. The information that the CHS provides on the sorts of people who are prospective purchasers, and the reasons why some tenants may not be considering purchasing, is a useful addition to the Department of Environment's own statistics on the way the policy is working. In addition useful data can be made available on tenure types, rents and the take-up of rent and rate rebates. We are also asking an extensive range of questions relating to rent, rate and electricity arrears in order to get an overall picture of the debt problem in Northern Ireland.

- Q5(A) This question is important since skips are made according to the type of tenure.
 - NB Rent-free <u>does not</u> refer to those on Housing Benefit who pay no rent.
- Q5(B) Sheltered accommodation is a scheme usually for pensioners where several houses or bungalows are supervised by a warden. This should be asked if Q5(A) is coded 4-6.

Outright owners or owner-occupiers skip to Q9.

- Q6 This question refers to the usual rental amount. Pounds and pence should be entered in the appropriate boxes, and the period covered also completed using Prompt Card A.
 - <u>NB</u> Prompt Card A is a standard period code card which is used throughout the questionnaire with reference to many different subjects.
- Q7 We want to know if tenants pay any payment element for specific services either along with or included in their rent. If they do, go to Q7(A).
- Q7(A) If they do make any such payment for services either along with or included in their rent, ring '1' in the column headed 'Pay' for the relevant item. Then record the amount and the period in the appropriate row. Make a note of what the items other than lighting and heating/hot water are in the space provided.
- Q7(B) This is to check if the respondent <u>included</u> the service charge in the amount of rent they told you at Q6. If they did, enter '1' in the appropriate row of the column headed 'Include'. If they did not, enter '2' in the appropriate row of the column headed 'Include'.

NB District Heating

A decreasing proportion - about 2% - of NIHE properties are equipped with District Heating systems. Payment for the heat and hot water supplies is normally made with the rent, but using a separate paying-in book. Record the amount paid for District Heating and the period covered <u>HERE</u> (under heating/hot water), and NOT in the Fuel section.

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- Q8 This question does not necessarily relate directly to current rent arrears; it relates to arrears in the previous 12 months. It is asked of all renters.
- Q8(B) If in arrears, specify the amount; if the respondent is unsure seek an estimate.
- Q8(C) Rent arrears are such a problem in Northern Ireland that an idea of the length of time in arrears is very important to policy makers.

NB This question applies to current rent arrears only.

Similarly trying to establish if the arrears problem is increasing or decreasing is also important. Q8(D)-(F) attempts to obtain detailed information on this.

- <u>NB</u> The amount of detail required for this question is very necessary. Poverty and debt are more widespread in Northern Ireland than in the rest of the UK, and it is necessary for decision-makers to get a clear picture of the problem to help those in need.
- Q9 Some people renting their accommodation are responsible for separate rates bills as well. This is not the case for people renting from the NIHE, all of whose rates are included in the rent; these should be coded as '2'. NIHE renters should then skip to Q(9)B. Those who are rent free should only be asked "Do you pay rates?".
- Q9(B) Housing Benefit is a scheme to help people with their rent and rates payments. From November 1983 it replaced the previous system of rent rebates, rent allowances, rate rebates and the assistance that people used to get with housing benefit costs through Supplementary Benefit.

The Housing Executive pays Housing Benefit to its own tenants and the tenants of private landlords and housing associations. The Department of the Environment's Rating Division pays Housing Benefit to those who own their own homes.

Housing Executive tenants on Housing Benefit have their rent and rates charges reduced at source.

<u>Private tenants</u> on Housing Benefit receive fortnightly Northern Bank cheques from the Housing Executive to cover all or part of their rent and rates charges.

Home owners on Housing Benefit have their rates charges reduced.

Those people on <u>Supplementary Benefit</u> do not receive an allowance for rent and rates in their Supplementary Benefit. Instead the DHSS informs the Housing Executive or Rating Office, and they will then be considered for a full rebate or allowance.

<u>NB</u> This is not 'rent free', and should not be confused with the rent free category mentioned in Q5(A).

- Q11 This question asks about the source of the mortgage or loan raised to purchase the property. Code 7, 'employer', should be used only if none of codes 1-6 applies. An example of an employer not falling into codes 1-6 would be the Civil Service, which can give home loans.
- Qs 12 & These questions ask about current housing costs for owner-occupiers 13 with a mortgage or loan. This includes those in Co-ownership.

In the case of accommodation owned jointly or solely by anyone outside the household, eg a current or ex-spouse, record only the amounts paid by this household.

- Q12 There are two main types of mortgage arrangement:
 - (a) Interest and principal usually called a repayment mortgage.

In this type each instalment consists of two elements; one is an amount to repay part of the original loan (or principal), and the other amount is towards the interest on the balance of the loan outstanding. Initially most of each instalment is for interest, but as the years go by an increasing proportion of each instalment is repayment of the original loan. The payment is made directly to the organisation granting the mortgage, eg the Building Society.

(b) Interest only - usually called an endowment mortgage.

In this type an endowment insurance policy is taken out with an insurance company at the same time as the mortgage, and it is arranged that when the policy matures it will repay the original sum borrowed under the mortgage. The principal thus remains outstanding until then, and the only payments made in the meantime are the insurance premium (to the insurance company) and the interest on the mortgage (to the building society or whoever else granted the mortgage).

- Q12(A)(ii) If the mortgage is not linked with an endowment policy then check how the loan will be repayed. This could be by some other arrangement with an insurance company or lending agency.
 - NB Interest-only payments are coded at Q12, NOT Q13.

Do NOT include in either Q12 or Q13:

- (a) mortgage protection premiums
- (b) house insurance premiums.
- Q13 Interest and principal:

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This is the most common method of mortgage. This is coded at Q13, NOT at Q12. There is only one payment to one source (usually a building society).

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Purpose of Section

It is known that fuel costs in Northern Ireland are much higher than those in other areas of the UK - we have no natural gas, all coal has to be imported and so on. Since heat is such an important need and outlay on fuel such a large proportion of weekly expenditure, this section monitors fuel costs over a period of time, types of heating systems used, and to what uses various fuels are put. The section also looks at possession of consumer durables.

Q14 Central heating: includes any system whereby two or more rooms of any type are heated from a central source such as a boiler, a back boiler, an open or closed fire (eg a Baxi high-output fire or a Rayburn closed fire), or the electricity supply. This definition includes a system where the boiler or back boiler heats one room and also supplies the power to heat another room. CH also includes underfloor heating and hot air ducts (but probe as to the actual fuel used). CH DOES NOT include appliances plugged into the mains circuit at the wall but DOES include storage heaters IF THEY ARE

mains circuit at the wall but <u>DOES</u> include storage heaters IF THEY ARE ON A SEPARATE CIRCUIT. If the informant is unsure, ask to see for yourself. If the informant has CH in the accommodation but says that they never use it, this is still to be coded as having CH - probe for full or partial CH.

Full CH - all the house is heated from one central power source (can exclude boxroom, toilet, &c). Partial CH - two or more rooms, but not all main rooms and/or bedrooms, heated from one source.

- <u>NB</u> If heated from open or closed fire, the room in which the fire is situated need not have a radiator in it. Where a household has only one room in the accommodation, treat it as CH if that room is heated from a central source <u>along</u> with other rooms in the house or building.
- Q14(A) We are interested in the fuel used. If it is a dual system code as applicable, <u>provided</u> that both power sources feed into the system. If it is code 13, 'other form of dual system', make a note alongside the question giving details. Some NIHE properties have District Heating, where there is one central power house in the area/block and heat is piped to individual houses in this case the house will be metered. This is code 10.
- Q14(B) Here we want the <u>type</u> of CH system, NOT the fuel used. In some cases the two concepts go together, eg "oil-fired central heating", but other systems can use a variety of fuels - radiators can be powered by an oil boiler, a gas boiler, from a back boiler off a coal fire, &c.

Codes 4 to 6 are to be used for dual systems. If one component of the system is solid-fuel-powered with a closed fire, range or other type of solid-fuel boiler, use code 4; if one component of the system is solid-fuel-powered with an open fire, use code 5. Code 6 is to be used for systems not having a solid fuel component; these should have been coded 13, 'other dual system', at Q14(A).

Note code 8 - this includes oil-filled radiators such as Dimplex. Code this only if they are plugged into a separate circuit from the mains (White Meter, &c). Other Dimplex heaters are not usually CH but "stand-alone" electric heaters. Use code 11 for NIHE District Heating CH; we do not require further details of the method of heating used.

Q14(C) Everyone is asked this question. For CH owners we want any other heating source they possess. If no CH, leave out the phrase in the brackets. Multicode all heating methods owned by the informant. For CH owners, only code 'open fire' (i), 'closed fire' (ii) or ' 'range' (iii) if they are separate from the CH system power source.

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- Q14(D) Record what the informant considers to be their most important source of winter and summer heating; note this is <u>NOT</u> what fuel is used. If a dual system CH is used, probe for the part of the system which the informant considers to be the major power source and record this.
- Q15(A) Here the emphasis is on the Fuel used by EVERTBODY, not just CH owners (though in this case you will have a useful reminder from Q14(A)). Show Prompt Card C and ring the '1' opposite each fuel used regardless of what it is actually used for. Having found out which fuels are used, the next job is to find out for each fuel what purpose it is used for and details of how much is used.
 - NB: District Heating costs, &c, are recorded at Q7.
 - NB: we differentiate between:
 - (a) ordinary coal or slack (including anthracite)
 - (b) coke or smokeless coal ie the treated type of solid fuel (c) turf, logs, &c.

Liquid Petroleum Gas - LPG ('Calor Kosangas', 'Ergas', 'Flogas', &c)

With the decline of Town Gas, LPG ('Calor Gas', &c) is becoming more popular. There are three major systems that you may encounter:

- (a) Storage tanks for propane gas, holding 380, 1200 or 2000 litres. This gas may be used for both heating and cooking. Upon delivery an advice note will be presented, giving details of the quantity and cost of purchase. Record this type under 'LPG storage tank'. There may be a monthly rental charge for the hire of the storage tank; this is not to be included with the cost of purchase.
- (b) 251b butane gas cylinders. These are used for Superser heaters, and also for older types of gas cookers using <u>single-bottle</u> systems. Record these under 'LPG cylinder - cooking' or under 'LPG cylinder - heating' according to the purpose for which they are used.
- (c) 251b propane gas cylinders. These are used for the newer types of gas cookers equipped with <u>twin-bottle</u> systems; these are being used to replace Town Gas cookers. More rarely 291b cylinders are used. Record these also under 'LPG cylinder - cooking' or under 'LPG cylinder - heating' according to the purpose for which they are used.

Oil, Paraffin

There are two grades of oil commonly used in Central Heating systems. narely 28 second and 35 second; the latter is sometimes referred to as 'Paraffin Oil'. Both are sold in quantities normally over 100 gallons. and cost between 50p and 85p per gallon, depending on quantity ordered and time of year. Both of these grades of oil are to be recorded as 'Oil', even though on the fuel invoices the 35 second grade may be referred to as 'Paraffin Oil'. What should be recorded as 'Paraffin' are fluids such as "Esso Blue", "Esso Pink", &c, which are normally used to fuel small convector stoves. Paraffin is sold in much smaller quantities - 1 to 5 gallons at a time - and costs about f1.50p per gallon.

- Q15(B) <u>Heating</u> ask if they use any of the fuels for heating in the winter or the summer - ring the relevant '1' if they do.
- Q15(C) Cooking do the same for cooking.
- Q15(D) Quantity we are interested in how people buy fuels, in what amounts, &c. Record the quantity the informant bought the last time he/she made a purchase, eg 3 bags, 200 gallons, &c. If the informant only bought 1 bag of coal or turf, ask if it was bought from a retailer (eg a shop or a garage) or from a coal merchant, since size will differ between these two sources. If possible, record the weight of a bag, eg 25 lbs or 50 kg.
- Q15(E) Cost record the cost of the last purchase of each fuel. In the case of a rented turf bank, find out the yearly rental and record this.
- Q15(F) No. of weeks record the actual number of weeks that the informant thinks the fuel will last at the time of the interview.

Q15(G) Electricity and Town Gas

NB: If neither Electricity NOR Town Gas used, go to Q17.

First ask to see the last Quarterly Account or Advice Note - even if people pay by weekly instalments or have a meter, they are usually sent a quarterly account of how much they have consumed and what it cost. Record the ACCOUNT amount in the grid in the relevant position, DEDUCTING arrears, HP payments, rental charges, &c.

- Q15(H) Ask how they actually pay for their Electricity or Town Gas. <u>Note</u> that column E refers to Electricity and column G to Town Gas. If Town Gas payment is by account, go to Q16.
- Q15(I) For all Electricity users coded 2-7 at Q15(H), ask the amount they actually pay by weekly/monthly/budget account/put in the slot meter/ or is paid for them by the DHSS.

Also record the period to which the amount actually paid refers (whether weekly, monthly, &c).

- NB Most slot meters in Northern Ireland are COCD: only people in privately-rented accommodation will have ordinary slot meters.
- Q15(J) If a Town Gas user and pays by a method other than account (ie Q15(H), coded 2-7 in column G), proceed as for Q15(I).

- Q17 This question is being asked to provide the NIES with information about the number of cookers and the types of fuel they use.
- Q17(B) Here we are interested in the <u>power source</u>, <u>NOT</u> the make or whether it would be built-in, &c.
- Q18 You should include items that are either owned by the household or are available for use in the informant's accommodation. Rented items, eg a video recorder, are also included. Items stored or being repaired are included, but broken items which are not intended to be repaired are excluded.

With the exception of telephones, items available for communal use should be included only if they can be used in the informant's own accommodation; eg record a shared vacuum cleaner that the informant can use, but ignore a washing machine used in a communal laundry.

In the case of telephones, however, if the only telephone is a communal one (eg a coin box in the hall) record it only if you are interviewing the household responsible for paying the account.

Fridge/freezer - This has a separate outside door for the freezer compartment; do not confuse it with an ordinary fridge with a freezing compartment inside it.

<u>Washing machine</u> - include both automatics and twin-tub models, but exclude boilers with a separate agitator.

<u>Tumble drier</u> - this is a drum which dries by tumbling the contents in a stream of hot air (unlike a spin-drier). These are normally separate machines, but some washing machines now have a built-in facility for tumble drying; in this case code <u>BOTH</u> washing machine AND tumble drier.

<u>Colour and B&W TVs</u> - this year we are interested in finding out not just ownership of TVs but also the numbers of each type actually owned Thus, having ascertained that the household owns (or rents) a colour TV, ask the supplementary question of how many colour TVs are owned (or rented) by the household; record the response in the boxes provided at the right-hand margin of the questionnaire. Repeat the question if the household owns (or rents) a monochrome TV.

Do not record as a TV the type of high-resolution monitor screen for a home computer that cannot be used to receive a TV signal; however, do remember to include ordinary TVs that are being used in conjunction with home computers.

For each appliance owned (or rented) ask if it was acquired (ie bought or received as a present) in the last 12 months. If it was not, then just code '1'; if it was acquired in the last year, then double code as '1' AND '3'. You may ask either if all the items are owned and then if any have been acquired in the last 12 months, or ask both questions item by item. For households where there are more than one colour or monochrome TVs, if any of them has been acquired in the last 12 months, then double code as '1' and '3' in the relevant category.

Q19 We would like to know if the family has a car or van (NOT a caravan) available for general use, even if it is supplied by the employer of a member of the household or is a business one.

Purpose of Section

One major weakness in the collection of criminal statistics is that the figures quoted refer only to <u>reported</u> crime. 1985 CHS has been the only previous attempt to measure the extent of unreported crime, so this year we are repeating the exercise in order to assess trends, &c. It relates exclusively to property crime, and not with offences against the person; these should not be included.

Q20 The important aspect of this question is that it is breaking and entering the informant's property <u>without</u> their permission. Include breaking and entering into garages, sheds and outhouses as well as into the actual residence. In this category you should also include entry under false pretences, eg someone gaining entry by posing as the gasman.

Exclude:

- (a) unsuccessful attempts to enter the property,
- (b) entry with permission (unless under false pretences) followed by (attempted) theft, eg a baby-sitter stealing something from the household.
- (c) theft by household members,
- (d) theft or vandalism more than 12 months ago.
- <u>NB</u> <u>Include</u> theft in a previous residence if it occurred within the 12-month criterion period.
- Q20(B) If there has been more than one theft, this refers to the last one.
- Q2O(C) 'Cash' (codes 1 or 3) refers purely to coinage and banknotes. Include as 'Goods' (codes 2 or 3) cash cards, credit cards, cheque books, &c, as these are not actually cash per se.
- Q2O(D) Accept estimates. Make sure that the total value is coded, but if it is clear that informants are indicating the value of different items, code the total. Remember to mark any estimates with an 'E'.
- Q2O(E) If any goods were stolen, ask if they were insured.
- Q2O(F) We want to know if the most recent incident was reported to the police.
- Q2O(G) If the incident was reported to the police, probe for the result or outcome - eg whether the police actually did anything about the incident, whether any stolen property was recovered in full or in part, &c.
- Q20(H) If the incident was not reported to the police, probe for the reasons why it was not.

Purpose of Section

This section, as well as providing intrinsically interesting information, gives respondents the opportunity to air their views on a number of issues of topical interest eg problems in Northern Ireland, crime and religion.

- Q1 Use Prompt Card D and code the answers in order of importance in the boxes provided. Do not ask for the second answer until a first answer has been given.
- Q2 The basic rationale of this question is to obtain up-to-date information on the sizes of the respective communities in Northern Ireland since this impinges on many Government policy areas eg health, housing, education and employment. Religious affiliation in Northern Ireland tends to define two groups with distinctly different values and attitudes about many aspects of life, not just the political one; for example, it has been found in EEC surveys that the two groups differ radically in their views on what causes poverty.

If an informant is unwilling to answer this question but you can see articles and objects in the room that give you a good idea of their religious denomination, make a note afterwards alongside Q2(A).

Q2(B) Even if someone cannot attend their place of worship because of age, infirmity etc but receives regular visits by a member of the clergy to their home, code as 'unable to attend' (code 7).

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- Q4 Crime and people's perceptions of the incidence of crime are of major importance to the NIO. These questions are designed to obtain information on how prevalent people think crime is in their area, whether or not crime is perceived to have increased and how safe people feel in their area at night.
- Q4(A) This question refers to the last 12 months (approximately). The definition of 'area' is very much the informant's own. Use Code 4 for those people who say that they cannot judge because they haven't lived in the area for long enough.
- Q4(B)(i) There are a number of different ways of categorising crime, many of which rely on fine distinctions in the law. The list we have produced (Prompt Card G) is of necessity ambiguous and open to varying interpretations; however, we feel that it is the best we can offer without introducing more complications than we can cope with.

Use Prompt Card G, and code all responses that the informant gives.

Notes:

- (B), vandalism, includes such offences as graffiti-writing, arson, &c.
- (D), <u>motoring offences</u>, includes the whole gamut of driving and driving-related offences, eg speeding, drunken driving, illegal parking, careless driving (eg without lights or use of direction indicators), &c.
- (E), assault in the street, includes both phsical and verbal attacks, eg by drunks, but NOT assaults with a sexual motive.
- (F), <u>burglaries</u>, includes all breaking and entering offences, stealing from houses, &c.
- (G), <u>sexual crimes</u>, inludes rape, sexual assault, indecent exposure, indecent acts between men, &c.
- (H), theft from you personally outside your home. This is a difficult category to explain adequately as it includes more than one type of offence. Firstly, it stresses outside the home in order to exclude 'aggravated burglary'. Secondly, it mentions 'you personally' to bring in the idea that the offence may include some dimension of the use of violence or the threat of violence. This category therefore includes mugging and pick-pocketing as well as hijacking of cars, &c.
- (I), theft when you are absent. Again, this is difficult to explain adequately. However, it is mainly what is regarded in law as 'proper' theft, ie the stealing of goods without your knowledge. Theft of goods from your car, or from the pocket of your coat when it is hanging up in a restaurant, are examples of the type of offence we are looking for here.
- (K), joyriding, is sufficiently common for it not to need much explanation. Try to distinguish it from (C), car theft.
- (L), <u>murder</u>, could be used to include other terrorist crimes of violence due to "The Troubles".

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EDUCATION

Purpose of Section

This section is designed to provide information about the education of the population and to monitor changes in qualified manpower over time. Apart from the Department of Education, other departments will use this information as background material. The information on qualifications, in conjunction with data from the income section on earnings is used by the Department of Education as part: of their work on the rate of return to the economy of expenditure on higher education. Informants aged 70 or over are <u>NOT</u> asked this section: they should go straight to the Employment section.

- Q1 If you already know that your informant is currently at secondary school, code 21 without asking the question. By school we mean <u>ONLY</u> primary, secondary or grammar schools - NOT college or any other form of education. The age we wish to record is that at which the informant left full-time continuous compulsory secondary education: thus if the informant left secondary school to attend any other type of educational establishment, eg an FE or Tech College, the age to be recorded is that at which he/she left secondary school. If, however, he/she moved school after the age of 16 to another secondary school, then the age to be recorded is that at which he/she left the subsequent secondary school.
- Q2 This question is designed to establish whether informants have ever had any further education since leaving school. If so, they are then asked first about any courses they may be engaged on <u>at present</u> at Q2(A) and then about their <u>last</u> full-time education (Q3).

Further education <u>includes</u>:

- any course attended at any type of college of further education, university, teacher training establishment, polytechnic, &c (including secretarial courses).
- Open University courses.
- Training given to nurses, physiotherapists, radiographers, and similar paramedical professions.
- Day-release courses.
- Sandwich and block-release courses (Sandwich courses tend to be up to 6 months in college and 6 months at work; block-release courses average 8 weeks or less in college per year).

Further education excludes:

- In-service training courses.
- Leisure classes (if queried these are courses not normally leading to an examination or qualification).
- Vocational training given by an employer (see Q2(A) below): if in doubt whether to include or not, code as 'Yes' and make a note.
- Studying on one's own without attendance at any college (again with the exception of the Open University).
- O2(A) If the informant is at present undertaking some form of higher education course which is not included in codes 1-7, then code as 'Other type of course', (Code 8). If, however, the informant has had some Eorm of higher education course but has now <u>finished</u> it, then code as 'Has now finished course' (Code 9). For students interviewed during their vacation, code the course and type of institution they were attending in the previous term, <u>provided</u> they will be attending again when the vacation is over (if their return is dependent on examination results, assume that these will be passed). If next term they will be attending a different type of institution (eg going from school to university) code the new course and type of institution, even if the offer of a place is conditional upon, say, obtaining certain GCE 'A' Level grades.

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Q3(A)/(B) We wish to know the type of Eull-time education an informant last had. Full-time further education received outside the UK is included here.

> Note the two forms of this question; form (A) is for those currently attending a full-time educational institution - in this case we want to know what it is. In the case of students waiting to go to college or university, code the one to which they will be going. Form (B) is for those who have finished full-time education - we want to know what it was. It is FULL-TIME education we are interested in here, not part-time, day release at Polytechnic, Open University, etc.

NOTE

- (a) 'University' (code 2) excludes Open University (part-time).
- (b) 'University' (code 2) includes medical doctors, and students reading for medical degrees.
- (c) 'Nursing school/teaching hospital' (code 3) applies to nurses, physiotherapists, and people in similar paramedical professions. Those training for a qualification in these areas may not regard themselves as being students since they normally work in a hospital at the same time. However, we wish to treat them as students because the practical aspect of their course is an essential ingredient of their training which they must do to gain a qualification. This ruling also applies to nursery school teachers, but not to doctors, whose practical work in hospitals always forms a part of their degree course and who should therefore be coded as 'university', code 2 (see (b) above).
- (d) Students on a Sandwich course: it is immaterial thether the student is in the college or working part of the course at the time of the interview.

NOTE ALSO

- (e) The following are NOT counted as full-time education:
 - Evening and day- or block-release courses.
 - Any course lasting less than 3 months altogether.

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Encourage informants to study the whole of Prompt Card H. There is a tendency to minimise attainments - any qualification or certificate counts, including apprenticeships in particular. Prompt for the grade of CSE where appropriate.

NOTE

- (a) For qualifications numbered 1-7, record the number of subjects passed in the boxes as indicated. For qualifications numbered 8-18, ring the code '1' as applicable.
- (b) If a subject was passed more than once at the same level, count as once only.
- (c) In the case of **CSE** (where there is no pass or fail), count all according to grade. This examination started in NI in 1973.
- (d) In the case of GCE 'O'Levels, up until 1975 pass grades were 1-6 inclusive, and fail grades were 7, 8 and 9. Since 1975 a five-point grading scale has been operating; grades awarded are now A-E with no pass or fail. In both the former and the more recent system candidates could receive an ungraded result which would not appear on their certificate. This, along with the previous 7, 8 and 9 grades are to be considered as fails. The important point is that we require examinations passed, not those entered for.

- In col 3, record the awarding institution (not necessarily the same as the establishment which ran the course or where the examination was sat). This detail is needed because in some cases the awarding institution will affect the coding; eg an HA degree means different things in Scottish, Oxford and Cambridge, and other UK universities.

LANGUAGE

This preamble to Q5 and Q6 gives the essential background to these questions, and may also be useful by way of introduction. The questions cover:

- (a) The level of knowledge of and interest in the 9 European languages among the population of NI as a whole. Since CHS covers the whole adult population the information collected will extend beyond that available for the school-age population. Many people choose to learn a language outside of the school situation and for many different reasons.
- (b) Formal and informal study of language is recorded.
- (c) Any qualification which may have been obtained in the languages is recorded.
- (d) Current ability to use language is assessed on a self-reporting basis. This is an important element since the level of current language ability can vary widely, irrespective of the level to which it has been studied. Current ability is self-assessed under four separate headings, regarded as the principle aspects of language ability:
 - (1) understanding the spoken language;
 - (2) speaking ability:
 - (3) reading ability;
 - (4) writing ability.

Each of these is assessed by reference to a list of three options illustrated by example.

- (e) Personal interest in and opinion on the importance of the 9 languages is recorded.
- (f) A separate question, more restricted in scope, vill be asked in relation to children in the household. Children under 16 are not interviewed in CHS, but it is nevertheless important to assess the extent of language ability among this group. While statistics may be already available on the school population, CHS offers the additional ability to look at language ability within the context of the home and family and eg in relation to parent's ability or interest in language.

This is an important section of the CHS questionnaire and will be of interest to many involved in the language field. Advice on the content of the questions has been received from the modern language inspectors of DENI. The results may have vide-ranging implications both for teaching methods and the priorities given to the various languages in school curricula.

Q5 A preamble has been provided to give respondents a background to the section. Please read this out as it places the questions in their proper context.

Ask first whether English is the respondent's first language. By this is meant the language they learnt first as a child. The answer to this question will normally be yes, but amongst some minerity communities in NI an alternative may be given which you should specify on the questionnaire, eg Chinese.

PROMPT CARD I gives the complete list of 9 European languages around which the remaining parts of the question are phrased. This card will be used several times throughout the section.

75(A) This question establishes those languages from the list that the respondent has any knowledge of. The interpretation of this statement should be left to the respondent. It will include languages studied formally/informally and also those of which the respondent may have acquired some knowledge simply through contact with native speakers, from other family members &c.

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The UK has been part of the European Community for 13 years, and among the member states of the Community at least 9 main languages are spoken. There is considerable interest in the extent to which people have any knowledge of the languages of the other states, since the understanding of the life and culture of other countries is often critically dependent on language. Ve vish to assess the extent of knowledge of European languages among people living in NI and their ability to use them. 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- Q5(B)-(I) These questions are asked only in relation to the languages specified at Q5(A).
- Q5(B)-(D) These questions are designed to be asked serially of each language in turn, ie if French is the first language on the list mentioned at Q5(A), then Q5(B) to Q5(D) should be asked of French, with the next language being treated in the same way.
- Q5(D) Record only the highest qualification obtained.

QUALIFICATIONS

A very wide range of qualifications in languages is available. The question attempts only to group them into 4 main categories. This is is an indication of the qualifications most likely to appear. Please make a note of any others which may be mentioned by respondents. In general, to be counted as a language qualification the respondent must have taken either a formal examination or a test of proficiency, either written or oral/aural. If this condition does not apply then enter as 'None' but make a note of any cases where there may be doubt.

(a) Degree

Include here University or Polytechnic degrees, both first degrees (eg BA) and higher degrees (eg HA, ?hO, DPhil). Only degrees awarded by recognised Universities should be included. The Open University is included.

(b) GCE A' Level

Apart from A' levels themselves there are a number of post A' Level qualifications which should be included here if they occur: (1) Institute of Linguists (2-year diploma course);

- (2) London Chamber of Commerce and Industry Examinations Board -Secretarial Language Certificate (2-year course), Advanced Secretarial Language Diploma (1-year course, postgraduate);
- (3) Royal Society of Arts Examinations Board (RSA) -Secretarial Language Diploma (1-year course, post A-level).
- (c) GCE 0' Level/CSE

Include O' levels and any CSE grades.

(d) Clerical, secretarial, other

This is a catch-all category for those not covered above. Examples of vhat may arise are:

- (1) Business and Technical Education Council (8 TECH) -
- a modern language may be offered at 8 TECH level; (2) City and Guilds of London Institute -
- Catering French may form a component of a CGLI course include only if this has been examined;
- (3) Certificate of Pre-Vocational Education a modern language could be a component in the post-16 CPVE:
- (4) Youth Training Programme a modern language could form a component of (18)
- (5) Graded Objectives in Modern Languages this is a relatively recent innovation in school-based teaching of modern languages, consisting of a series of graded courses and examinations designed by groups of teachers with certificates awarded to successful pupils. Certificates may be awarded by teachers' centre ok Education and Library Board;
- (6) Any other language proficiency awards should be recorded as 'Other', eg 'Fainne' in Irish.

You should record their answers on the grid by putting '1', '2', &c, against the languages as they mention them.

SHPLOTORNT

Purpose of Section

This survey is one of the main sources for supplying the Department of Economic Development with information on the size and composition of the workforce and on the extent of unemployment, which is a grave social and economic problem in NI. When linked with other sections these questions help economic planners by, for example, exploring the relationships between peoples' qualifications and the type of employment they follow.

Q1 This finds out the economic activity status of the respondent

Include as 'paid work last week':

- employment for <u>any</u> number of hours, including Saturday jobs and casual work, eg baby-sitting, running mail-order clubs, etc.
 - NB Some informants may not consider this to be 'serious' work, so please be prepared to probe those to whom you feel this may be applicable, eg housewives with dependent children;
- anyone who was paid a wage or salary by an employer while attending an educational establishment;
- wives working for any number of hours in their husbands' businesses as long as they were <u>paid</u>, ie received (or will receive) an amount of money in renumeration or a share in the profits;
- wives working <u>unpaid</u> in their husbands' businesses provided they work for 15 hours or more per week;
- anyone else working in a friend's or relative's business as long as they were paid, ie received (or will receive) an amount of money in renumeration or a share in the profits;
- anyone receiving training by their employers on the employers' premises, eg apprentices, 16-18 year olds on the Young Workers
 Scheme (in which an employer is subsidised by the OED for employing a person as long as he/she pays them £50 or less a week. The person is in a regular permanent job this is not the same as being on the Youth Training Programme.
- NB If the respondent is in full-time education, code 6 ('None of these') at Q1(B).

Informants vho are on Government-sponsored schemes, eg TP, ACE, etc, are also to be treated as economically inactive and coded as 6 ('none of these') at Q1(B).

YTP has a tvo-tiered structure as follows:

- (1) Guaranteed Year Provision for 16 year olds
 - Includes: Government Training Centre courses Work preparation units based in Community Workshops Work preparation courses based in FE Colleges Youthways courses based in FE Colleges Employer-led schemes or Partnerships

None of the schemes listed above vill generate 'real and permanent' jobs, and it has been decided to treat those 'employed' on them as economically inactive

Interviewers should probe at this point for the nature of young informants' employment especially. Many young people vill state that they are employed, but on a YTP; others, however, may not reveal this information.

31(A) Include any person vho vas absent from vork because of holiday, strike, sickness, maternity leave, lay-off. etc, provided that he/she has a job to return to with the same employer Do not include those receiving redundancy payments vho have no job to return to.

Do not include people who have a Job fixed up but who have not yet started work in it; these people should be coded 3 at Q1(B).

- Q1(B) Code 4. 'Looking for vork'
 - include anyone who vas out of employment but actively seeking vork last week, eg registered at a Government Jobcentre. Employment Office or Careers Office. or ar a private employment agency, or answering advertisements, advertising for Jobs, etc.
 - include informants 'on the books' of private employment agencies.
 - include those doing voluntary vork if they are <u>also</u> looking for vork

Code 5 'Intending to vork but prevented by temporarv sickness, etc'

- exclude anyone vhose temporary sickness or injury has already lasted longer than 28 days (ie 4 veeks), these people should be coded as 6 ('None of these')

Code 6 'None of these'

- include anyone vho vas economically inactive last /eek, le neither employed or seeking work
- include those vho vorked only for payment in kind. eg doing domestic vork in exchange for board and lodging but without any cash payment
- include people vho received on-the-lob unpaid training, eg physiotherapists

- include persons doing voluntary vork for which they receive no f payment (other than out-of-pocket expenses) and who are not looking for vork.
- include seasonal or casual workers who did not work last week, if none of the codes 3-5 apply.
- include students receiving full-time education, and anyone on YTP or similar Government-sponsored training scheme, etc (see above).
- Q2(A) This question is asked only of unemployed people vho are waiting to take up a job that they have already obtained (code 3 ar Q1(B)). Note that Government-sponsored schemes, YTP, etc, are nor counted as paid jobs.
- Q2(B) This question is addressed to all other unemployed people (code 4 or 5 at Q1(8)). It establishes whether an unemployed person has ever had a paid job; if they have not, and are not waiting to rake up their first-ever paid job, then they jump to Q13. If a person holds more than one job concurrently, then the job to be entered at Q3 is the 'main job', is the most remunerative one.

Unemployed persons who have had a previous job (coded 1 or 3 at Q2) should be asked for details of their last job, even though those coded 1 at Q2 are vaiting to take up another job. However, if those coded 1 at Q2 are waiting to take up their first-ever job, then note details of the job they are waiting to take up.

Ve need <u>full</u> and detailed information of both occupation and industry in order to classify a person's job into the three different coding frames of:

> SC - Social Class SEG - Socio-economic Group SIC - Industrial Group

Please note that we need job title, a full description of the work done, the main activity, level of skill and level of responsibility. Probe for details, especially in the case of ambiguous job titles such as "engineer" and "clerk" - the latter may range from a lowly counter clerk to the more prestiguous Town Clerk. If the person is a member of the Armed or Security Forces, please give their rank.

<u>Self-employed/employee</u>: in general you should accept the informant's answers, but if there is any doubt you should try to find out how they are described for Income Tax purposes. if applicable: the nature of the National Insurance contribution is a less important indicator.

- note that people working as **mail-order** agents, pools agents, babysitters, child-minders, etc, are usually classed as 'self-employed'.
- it is possible to be self-employed but to work under contract to an employer and be treated as an employee for tax purposes; this occurs in the construction industry, for example. Informants in this situation should be treated as self-employed.
- G?s are self-employed, but hospital doctors are employees.
- All directors, managers and company owners of Limited Companies are employees, not self-employed. Informants who give their occupations as company owner, director. etc, should therefore be asked whether it is of a Limited Company.

Note re agency employees: an employee obtaining work through an agency (eg secretaries. nurses. etc) may be either an employee of that agency or an employee of each different company they go to. When probing for occupation and industry establish which is the case. as this will affect answers about length of time with present employer and number of new employee jobs started in the last 12 months. If the person is an employee of the agency, the agency will normally pay part or all of the employee's National Insurance contribution.

73(A) The distinction between manager, foreman/supervisor and other employee is an important one, and you should try to distinguish if possible.

> 'Managers' are generally responsible for long-tern planning and have overall control over the workplace, often through the medium of foremen and supervisors.

'Foremen' and 'Supervisors' have day-to-day control of a group of workers whom they supervise directly, sometimes doing some of the work themselves.

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Ask or record the ansver as appropriate, remembering that job titles can be a useful indication of the level of responsibility but that they can also be misleading; eg a 'playground supervisor' supervises children, not employees, and thus should not be coded as a supervisor Similarly, a stores-manager may be a store-keeper, not an actual manager.

Separate questions are given for employees (Q6(A)) and the self-employed (Q6(B)).

For employees, please check that they have not included any paid or unpaid overtime at Q6(A).

For the <u>self-employed</u>, ask about the total hours they work in their main job. Most self-employed people don't think of themselves as working any overtime, and **so** for all self-employed we want to record their total hours.

The following points should be noted:

- If a person has started a new job in the reference period, the usual hours should relate to what the person expects them to be in the future.
- In the case of people who are 'permanently on call', make a full note of the circumstances and probe for the total hours usually worked when on call (excluding overtime) and enter this number of hours in the coding column.

If the informant has worked on and off for his/her present employer, ignore all previous spells of employment and code only the length of time in the current spell. Previous spells within the last 12 months will count as job starts - see instructions for 011.

- 010 We need to know whether or not a person was working as an employee 12 months ago in order to calculate the number of changes of employer he/ she has had in the 12-month period.

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- Q12 A 'main job' is defined as a person's most remunerative job at the time, even though it may be only a part-time or casual job. It may, of course, have been the person's only job at the time.

The question relate to the father's usual job or occupation; if the informant is in doubt as to which was the 'usual' job, record the one that was held for the longest period of time. If the father is currently working, it is still the usual occupation that we require.

There are some cases when it will be impossible for informants to describe their father's occupation. In this circumstance note the fact that no information could be obtained and say why. If the informant does not know about his/her father but volunteers information about a father substitute. eg a step-father, this should be recorded.

Instructions for this question are the same as for Q3; where possible obtain the full specifications of job, industry, level of responsibility, etc.

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HEALTH

Purpose of Section

The DHSS needs more information on the extent of sickness and the use that people make of various health and welfare services. The theory that illness and unemployment are related may be tested by CHS by comparing illness and use of sevices across different employment groups. It is also suspected that health services do not always reach those who need them most.

Several of the questions in the Section allow room for recording only a limited number of occurrences of answers, eg 0s 4 and 12 to 20. In all cases use spare sheets provided for additional responses.

- Q1 We are interested in what the informant considers to be good health. This question provides a link with Q2 and tells us the informant's own impression of his/her health.
- Q2(A) We are interested only in what the illness or disability <u>is</u>; we do not want an explanation of what caused it. Make sure that the informant mentions all his/her longstanding illnesses. Stress the <u>longstanding</u> nature of any illness.
- Q2(B) We are interested only in whether the illness(es) limits activity in any way. If the informant suffers from more than one longstanding illness it does not matter if one, some, or all limit activities.
- Q3 This asks about the **2** weeks ending yesterday. Take care to ensure that people are talking only about things that happened in the last **2** weeks.

'Things you usually do' means whatever would have been the normal activity on the days of the illness had not the informant been ill ie attending work or school, doing housework, having coffee mornings, shopping, taking part in leisure/sporting activities, etc.

Q3(B) The number of days required is the number within the last 2 weeks, <u>not</u> a total number of days affected by an illness first developed more than 2 weeks ago. The number recorded should therefore never exceed 14.

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Q4 Talking to a doctor can mean seeing him (at home, surgery, &c) or speaking to him on the telephone: in some cases informants may say that they called to pick up tablets or a prescription; however, enter details only if the informant actually talked to a doctor. Do not count social chats with a doctor who happens to be a friend or relative.

Note that the question asks for details of consultations in the 2-week period ending yesterday.

Use spare sheets for further consultations.

- Q4(8 -(I) Question 4(8)-(I) refers to the two most recent consultations with a doctor. If there has been only one consultation in the last 2 weeks fill in the "last" column accordingly. If there has been more than two consultations in the last 2 weeks, then use spare sheets for further consultations.
- Q4(8 Note that the Person Number is only given if the consultation was on behalf of someone else in the household; in that case give the Person Number of the person on whose behalf the consultation was made.
- Q4(C) Private medical treatment is that paid for by the informant OK by somenbody else (eg employer, insurance company).
- Q4(E) Note that the question is intended to cover visits to doctors in their own surgeries/centres/practices only. If it emerges here that the doctor was seen at a hospital clinic or local authority clinic, you should delete the entry.

If the doctor was seen at a Health Centre you will need to make a special check because Health Centres will usually include both doctors' surgeries and local authority clinics (eg child welfare, family planning). You must check therefore whether the informant saw the doctor in his capacity as a GP in his surgery at the Centre ok whether they say the doctor in charge of a local authority clinic; in the latter case, delete the entry.

- Q4(F) Use the alternative word "send" with informants who talked to the doctor on the telephone.
- Q4(H) Question 4(H) is to be asked only of those informants who have reported suffering from a long-standing illness (ie code 1 ('Yes') at Q2) and whose consultation with the doctor vas on their own behalf (ie code 1 ('informant') at Q4(B)). Unless both of these apply, code X ('does not apply/others').
- Q4(I) Question 4(I) is to be asked only of those informants who have reported cutting down on their usual activities in the last 2 weeks because of illness (ie code 1 ('Yes') at Q3) and whose consultation with the doctor was on their own behalf (ie code 1 ('informant') at Q4(8)). Unless both of these apply, code X ('does not apply/others').

- 05 For this question, asking about visits to hospital outpatient departments, a 3-month time period is to be used, is the last 3 complete calender months prior to the month in which you are interviewing. Therefore, if for example you are interviewing on 30 November, specify the months of August, September and October, and enter in their <u>numerical</u> form (is 08, 09, 10) the months referred to in the spaces provided at this question.

Qs7-10 Accidents

These questions on accidents at home were previously included in 1984 CHS. DHSS has asked us to include these questions again, and to extend them to cover accidents outside the home. Only accidents resulting in treatmentby a doctor or at a hospital should be included. The CHS information will supplement the Department's ovn statistics from hospitals with accident and emergency units.

We want to know the details of any accident that the informant may have had in the last three complete calender months (defined as at 05) that vas serious enough for he/she to seek medical attention, either at a doctor's or at a Hospital. Accidents that led merely to telephone consultations only are excluded, as are consultations about an accident happening to some other person.

- Include: Accidents caused by informant's ill-health, eg had epileptic fit and consequently fell down stairs. Accidents where the informant may not have seen a GP or gone to hospital immediately, eg cut finger, but only vent to the doctor a week later when it turned septic.
- Exclude: Injuries that vere the result of attacks by insects and other animals or by other persons. Accidenst as a result of which the informant sought advice other from a GP or a hospital.

If the informant has suffered more than one accident in the last three complete calender months which has resulted in he/she seeking medical attention, use spare sheets to record details of these.

- Q7(A) See instruction at Q5 for defining the 3-month time period.
- Q7(B) Try to obtain from the informant a brief description of the accident that occurred, including some indication of the injury or injuries that the informant sustained. These details will allow us to check whether the incident should be recorded as an accident.
- Q7(C) Code the first location that applies.
 - 1 include accidents in any private home, garden, garage, drive, garden path, &c.
 - 2-3 this is any public or private road, street, lane, &c, where motor vehicles are allowed; include car parks here.
 - 2 include accidents involving moving cars, motorcycles, lorries, &c (but not bicycles - code these by location).
 - 4-8 include rhe grounds of the places listed , except car parks which should be coded 2 or 3.
 - 4 this is the informant's normal workplace, If normal job is a travelling one, then normal workplace is the informant's base (eg HQ, bus depot). Code accidents occurring while travelling for work reasons or to and from work according to location.

- Q8 'Paid vork' includes any kind of paid vork vhatsoever
- Q8(A) We want to find out about injuries occurring either at the vorkplace or during vorking hours. An accident that happened to the informant vhilst he/she vas travelling to vork (ie commuting) is not counted as having occurred virhin vorking hours, unless that travelling vas an integral part of the job, eg an accident happening to a van-driver whilst out on his/her rounds

Include accidents vhilst working at home if the informant was being paid by their employer, or if it was parr of the business of a self-employed person

- Q8(B) Count only absences from vork of a full vorking day or longer.
- Q8(C) Code 3, 'Off vork for other reason', vould be used €or example in the circumstance where an informant has not yet returned to vork after an accident because he/she is taking leave off vork, even though they have fully recovered from any injuries sustained.
- Q8(D) 'All spells' indicates that you are to include days taken off vork for, say, going back to the doctor for check-ups, &c, after the informant has returned to vork after an accident.

Q9(A) We are trying to distinguish between accidents that happened whilst the informant vas "just walking" and those that happened whilst he/ she was involved in some other form of sport or activity.

Include sport/physical exercise which is part of the informant's work, eg a gym teacher.

DHSS do not want details of accidents whilst walking; thus it is important to ask and code **so** that we can exclude them.

- Q10 Parts (A) to (C) are only asked if the informant vent to Hospital as a result of his/her accident.
- Q10(C) By 'overnight' we mean a full night's stay in a bed. Include all stays related to the accident even if not contiguous.
- Q11 This question about dental health is meant to supplement DHSS records on the dental health of the population. The DHSS is particulasly interested in the future demand for dental services.

This question will monitor changes in the dental health of the population, one example of which is the increased proportion of people who still have some or all of their natural teeth.



- Q15(A) This part of O15 asks for the number of outpatient visits by all children in the household in the last 3 months. Again, Person Numbers are taken from the Household Schedule. The 3-month reference period is defined exactly as in Q5.

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Q17 See notes for Qs 7-10.

Qs 17-20 are a new set of questions dealing with accidents occuring to children. We want to know the details of any accidents that up to two children for whom the the informant is responsible may have had in the last three complete calender months (defined as at QS), provided that these were serious enough for them to seek medical attention, either at a doctor's or at a Hospital. Accidents that led merely to telephone consultations are excluded.

If any child has suffered more than one accident in the last three complete calender months which has resulted in he/she seeking medical attention the two columns may be used for the same child, entering the Person Number in each column.

If more than two children for whom the informant is responsible has suffered an accident in the last three complete calender months which has resulted in them seeking medical attention, record details of all children; use spare sheets as necessary.

If more than one child has had an accident it would be best to ask Q17 to Q20 for one child, and then to repeat Q17 to Q20 for the other. Be sure to enter the Person Numbers of the children in the relevant boxes, and to record your answers for each child in the appropriate column.

- Q17(A) See instruction at 05 for defining the 3-month time period.
- Q17(8) Try to obtain from the informant a brief description of the accident that occurred, including some indication of the injury or injuries that the child(ren) sustained. Enter the Person Number(s) of the child(ren) in the boxes provided.
- Q17(C) See notes for Q7(C). If the accident occurred in a school playground, code this as 6, 'School', NOT 9.
- Q18 'Paid work' includes any kind of paid work whatsoever.

This Question is only asked regarding children aged between 12 and 16; others go to Q19.

GO TO FAMILY INFORMATION SECTION

Purpose of Section

Family Information

Figures collected from the Family Information section are used to provide Government Departments with information about the size and composition of the current population, both at national and regional levels; estimates of the future population can also be calculated. These are needed in order to plan the provision of public services, eg DENI need to know the size of the school-age population, DHSS need to estimate the demand for hospital and social services, and DOE and NIHE to estimate the demand for housing.

Over recent years a number of social changes have occurred that are affecting the size and composition of the population. It is therefore necessary to monitor changes over time in order to provide up-to-date information **so** that demographic implications can be assessed. This is why the information on marital and fertility history from this section of CHS is important. Examples of these changes are the trend towards smaller families, an increasing tendency for married women to postpone having a family, and the increases in marital breakdown and cohabitation.

The Section now covers all women, married and single, aged between 16 and 59. It is hoped in particular to fill a gap in the fertility data on births to teenage girls. This information will help to clarify some of the underlying assumptions which are made for population projections, and will also be useful to other Government departments, eg it will help the DHSS with the projection of social security expenditure.

Please introduce the Family Information Section fully, using the notes above, to all women.

Self-completion forms

Ve have devised a simple self-completion form to be used by women where appropriate. This can ensure confidentiality and avoid possible embarrassment, eg if asking about illegitimate births in front of other people. We do not lay down rules for the use of self-completion forms, but for guidance recommend their usage in the following circumstances:

- when interviewing any women in the presence of other people, unless the woman is married and the only other person present is her husband/partner; however, even if the only other person present is her husband/partner, the woman or you may prefer to use a self-completion form.
- interviewing single women aged 16-19 whether or not in the presence of other people.

The design of the self-completion forms have been simplified, and they therefore differ from the main schedule in layout and signposting.

When explaining how to fill in the form please ensure that informants understand the signposting system. The signposts are on the right of the answer boxes. Informants are asked to 'ANSWER' a question when it is the next question on the same page, or to 'GO TO' a question when they have to skip a question or go to another page. Because of their length it is clearly impossible for you to check the forms thoroughly during the interview, but whenever possible you should at least scan the forms to check that the correct sequence of questions has been followed, that there are no obvious inconsistencies, and that the written answers are legible In the case of anyone who has had more than 12 children, check that they have given information for all of them, this may entail giving them an extra page to fill in

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General notes

Dates

It is important that you try to obtain all dates accurately in this section. Analysis of women's fertitlity often depends on collecting a complete history of marriage and childbearing from informants If an informant cannot remember a particular date, try to obtain an estimate or a guess, to be indicated by an 'E' in the margin in the usual way. Please avoid unqualified `don't knovs`

Dates are asked for in terms of months and years. You should record these in numeric form, eg August 1950 should be recorded as month 08 and year 50. Do not forget the leading zero in the months January-September (01-09).

Informants using a self-completion form should give their answers in the vay they find most convenient.

- Q1 Ideal number of children this is asked of all men and women aged between 16 and 59, providing a lead-in to the Section. Informants aged 60 and over are not asked this Section; they should go to the Police Section.
- CHECK A ALL HEN go out at this point.
- CHECK B The self-completion form should be offered now

Please code the action you took by ringing the appropriate number.

CHECK C Take the informant's marital status from the household grid, pl.

Remember to fill this in for all women, especially for those who have filled in a self-completion form

Purpose of Section

This section deals with some aspects of the service provided by the Royal Ulster Constabulary in Northern Ireland. We are interested in the kind of situations in which members of the public call on the RUC for assistance, and how they think their request was handled. These questions were first asked in a survey similar to this one which was carried out over the water, and it is hoped to collect comparable information here in Northern Ireland.

After asking (C), go on to ask (A) for the next part of the question, until all eight parts of the question have been asked.

This number should be between 02 and 10, and should correspond with the code number in the left-hand column at Q2(D) above. Obviously, if the informant thinks that the service provided by the RUC does NOT need improving then Q2(E) is not asked.

GO TO INCOME SECTION

Purpose of Section

The main use of the Income Section is to provide a measure of overall income, which is an important classificatory item for all other sections of the questionnaire.

Some important uses of the Income Section are:

- to compare the income levels of people whose main or only source of income is state benefits with those of the rest of the population,
- to show to what extent particular state benefits are reaching households in need,
- to link qualifications and income in a kind of cost-benefit analysis called the 'Race of Return' for higher education, is a cost of higher education and the amount returned to the Exchequer in taxes, ic.

In the past years of C8\$, the lowest levels of co-operation have been found in this particular section. This year we have retained the considerably simplified section that was introduced last year; we are asking for much less detailed information about earnings especially.

- CHECK A Only the 808 is to be asked about total household income; this check filters him/her to Q1, with informants who are not 808s going to Check 8.
- 01 The informant (who should be the 404) is asked to respond by indicating on Prompt Card Q the letter corresponding to the total annual household income from all sources; this response is coded by ringing the appropriate code number in the adjacent column.
- CEECK B Ask <u>ALL</u> informants if they are in any form of paid work (as defined in the Employment Section). Those who are in paid work are asked Q2; those who are not in paid work **go** to Q3.
- Q2 The informant is asked to respond by indicating on Prompt Card P the letter corresponding to his/her own total annual income before deduction of income tax, National Insurance contributions, se; this response is coded by ringing the appropriate code number in the adjacent column.
