FAMILY CREDIT SURVEY

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1. INTRODUCTION

The Policy Studies Institute (PSI) is carrying out on behalf of the Department of Social Security a study of the effects of Family Credit. NOP Social and Political were commissioned as part of this study to conduct a survey among people who claim or are likely to claim Family Credit in 1991.

2. RESEARCH METHOD

2.1 The sample

The survey was carried out among a sample of people who receive child benefit. The main sample was selected from PSI by means of a postal sift of returned self-completion questionnaires. A further booster sample of Family Credit claimants was also selected by PSI.

A total of 2280 addresses for the main sample and 788 for the Family Credit booster sample were issued to the field department. Some addresses were kept in reserve in case the contact rate was less than originally expected.

The addresses were spread across 70 sampling points across the whole country and each point was equivalent to one postcode sector.

2.2 PILOTING THE QUESTIONNAIRE

2.2.1 Pre-pilot survey

A pre-pilot survey was carried out using a basic framework of a questionnaire designed as much "open-ended" material as possible. The questionnaire was basically there as a guideline to the interviewer to get the respondent talking about their circumstances.

The survey involved 6 interviewers who were personally briefed on 11th March and debriefed on 18th March after achieving 24 interviews.

The result of the pre-pilot interviews were used to produce a more structured questionnaire.

2.2.2 Pilot survey

A second pilot survey, using this questionnaire, was conducted by 6 interviewers in Cowdenbeath, Cleveland, Peterborough, Cardiff, Exeter and Hammersmith. Interviewers were briefed on 3rd June and de-briefed on 12th June after achieving 62 interviews. The pilot took place for two main reasons -to test the questionnaire and to measure respondent reaction.

2.3 THE FINAL QUESTIONNAIRE

The final interview involved four separate questionnaires: main questionnaire, future questionnaire, partner questionnaire and self-completion questionnaire. The main questionnaire contained largely factual questions and was used for interviewing the mother (or the partner in the case of single fathers).

- The future questionnaire, contained largely hypothetical questions about the future and was split into two sections. In the case of couples, one section was used for the mother and the other section for the partner. The determinant of who answered which section was based on working status and whether they were claiming Family Credit or not. Single respondents only answered one section, with the determinant being the same as for couples.

The partner questionnaire, as its name implies, was administered to the partner and contained similar factual questions to the main questionnaire.

The self-completion questionnaire contained attitudinal questions and was given to both mother and partner independently so that their answers could be compared.

2.4 SURVEY ADMINISTRATION

Fieldwork for the main stage of the survey took place between 24th July and 22nd September 1991 and in total 2328 interviews were achieved. This represents a contact rate of 82%. The breakdown of the contact rate is given over the page. All fieldwork was conducted by fully-trained NOP interviewers to the strict criteria of the Interviewer Quality Control Scheme.

Completed questionnaires were returned to an NOP coding team where they were checked in and the data entered onto our in-house computer facility. The data were checked against a detailed computer edit that searched for errors, omissions and inconsistencies.

For some errors force edits were agreed with PSI, for others the data set were referred to, and the remainder were left for PSI to deal with. The data were then supplied to PSI on a computer disk.

TECHNICAL NOTE

DSS/PRILIF Lone Parent Cohort Data Set

This note summarises key characteristics of the Lone Parent Cohort data file, and documents the data restoration and cleaning exercise undertaken to provide workable employment history information within the data set. The final section describes the *vectors* - collections of variables which can be referenced with an index - which categorise economic activity and partnership statuses during consecutive time periods.

Description of the data file

There are 989 cases on file - all who responded to the interview in 1991. There were 848 respondents in 1993, 726 in 1994 and 627 in 1995 (variable RESP). A postal questionnaire in 1992 was returned by 676 respondents. Original sample selection was from two sources:

1. selected with variable sampling fractions, from a large random postal sift. Serial numbers commence with '0' and sift data included on file.
2. selected from Family Credit (FC) records, to boost the number of family credit recipients. Serials commence with 'F'.

Broadly, workers and family credit recipients were over-sampled and those out of work under-sampled.

The main weighting variable is @alt_wt1 which corrects for variable sampling fractions and down-weights the combined sift and additional FC cases to the proportion of FC cases found at sift. This weight sums the data to 990 cases.

47 cases from the FC records nonetheless stated at interview that they were not in receipt of FC. The status of such top-up cases is unclear and @alt_wt1 assigns these cases a weight of zero.

There are more than 13,000 variables in the file "BDGH1.comp", described in the data dictionary file "dict". A more compact file, which omits interim derivation variables and some raw date information has been generated: "BDGH3.comp", dictionary: dict3. Data from all four main interviews and postal questionnaires has been combined with each year's variables identified as follows:

Checking and Editing Date Information

Work history grids

Date information has been subject to vigorous checking and a number of force edits have been implemented. These initially concerned a systematic interviewer error which arose in 1991 affecting economic activity grids for the period 1988-91. The fault meant economic inactivity grid dates coincided perfectly with employment grid dates. The edit 'shuffled' the economic inactivity dates so that start dates of periods of economic inactivity synchronised with the stop dates of jobs and vice versa. 25 cases were amended by this edit.

A filter error meant respondents with only one job between 1988 and 1991 did not enter the grid and so were not asked when this job began. And many with more than one job in this period who did enter the grid did not enter details of the current/most recent job. So there were 748 cases holding jobs between 1988 and 1991 for which no start date was recorded for the job at the 1991 interview.

As the 1993 interview asked for details of jobs held over the period 1991-93, the start date of continuing 1991 jobs was recorded for 386 1993 respondents. Also, the 1991 family credit history used grid dates which could be related through further questions to the start of the family credit job. Start dates of the family credit job could be estimated. A further imputation was used when a fully coded economic inactivity grid accompanied an incomplete work history. Start dates of the current/most recent job were inferred from the end of the most recent 'gap' (ie. period of economic inactivity) in the economic inactivity grid. A further 291 cases were amended by these imputations. Taking the use of these imputations and dates provided in 1993 together, spell start/end dates for 677 cases

were recovered, including restoration of job start dates for 605 (81 per cent) of the 748 cases for whom these were missing.

Where start dates were known or could be imputed, and fell between 1988 and 1991, date information concerning the activity which preceded it was often still omitted.

Thus, after imputation, the data set is still missing job start dates for the 1991 current/most recent job for 143 respondents including

- those who responded only in 1991 and who did not claim family credit
- those with more than one job between 1991 and 1993

and the data set is missing start dates for the economic activity before the current or most recent job, for 72 cases.

Date information from elsewhere in the questionnaires was checked and more mismatches identified:

Dates of birth

The only way to link children from one interview to the next, and one of the ways of identifying new, continuing or returned partners, was through using DOB information in the household grid. A number of transcription, recall errors were evident between years, and corrected.

- The same checking revealed that the survey contractors had assigned eight respondents incorrect serial numbers at some point in the study period. The records from each survey have thus been realigned. A new respondent was recruited 'by accident' in 1994. One case thus exists with no serial number and information in 1994 and 1995 only.

Partnership history

The most problematic of the dated material concerned partnership histories since dates of arrival and departure were highly liable to recall error. The dates of arrival and departure of partners present at earlier interviews might not coincide with the earlier interview date, and partners recorded at one point might not be recalled at a later one. Some of the lone parents in 1995 claimed to have been living continuously with their present partner for 5 or more years! The following rules guided the allocation of start and end dates:

The presence or absence of a partner in the household at the time of interview was taken as the strongest evidence of his being present or absent at that time. Partner arrival and departure dates were not allowed to conflict with this.

The earliest possible recall date is used . So the first preference for the arrival and departure dates of a partner who lived with the respondent in 1992 are taken from the 1993 interview. If, however, in the March 1992 postal questionnaire the 'lone' parent said she was not living with a partner, then the arrival date was shuffled back (to April 1992) or the departure date shuffled forward (February 1992), to produce the shortest conflicting spell.

Arrival dates and departure dates for the same partner do not always come from the same questionnaire. eg a 1992 arrival date and 1994 departure date would come from the 1993 and 1995 questionnaires, respectively.

When earlier interviews suggest no partner present at a particular time but a later interview gives an arrival date earlier than this time, the arrival date is shuffled on to the earliest date for which there is no earlier conflicting evidence.

For two cases, partners are coded as present at some point but arrival or exit dates are not known.

Family credit history

Trouble- and imputation-free!

Except that the 1991 interview coded all the (then) right-censored spells to end in December 1991. My coding treats these family credit spells as right-censored, except where information collected in later years told us otherwise.

The corrected date information was used to produce vectors (documented separately).

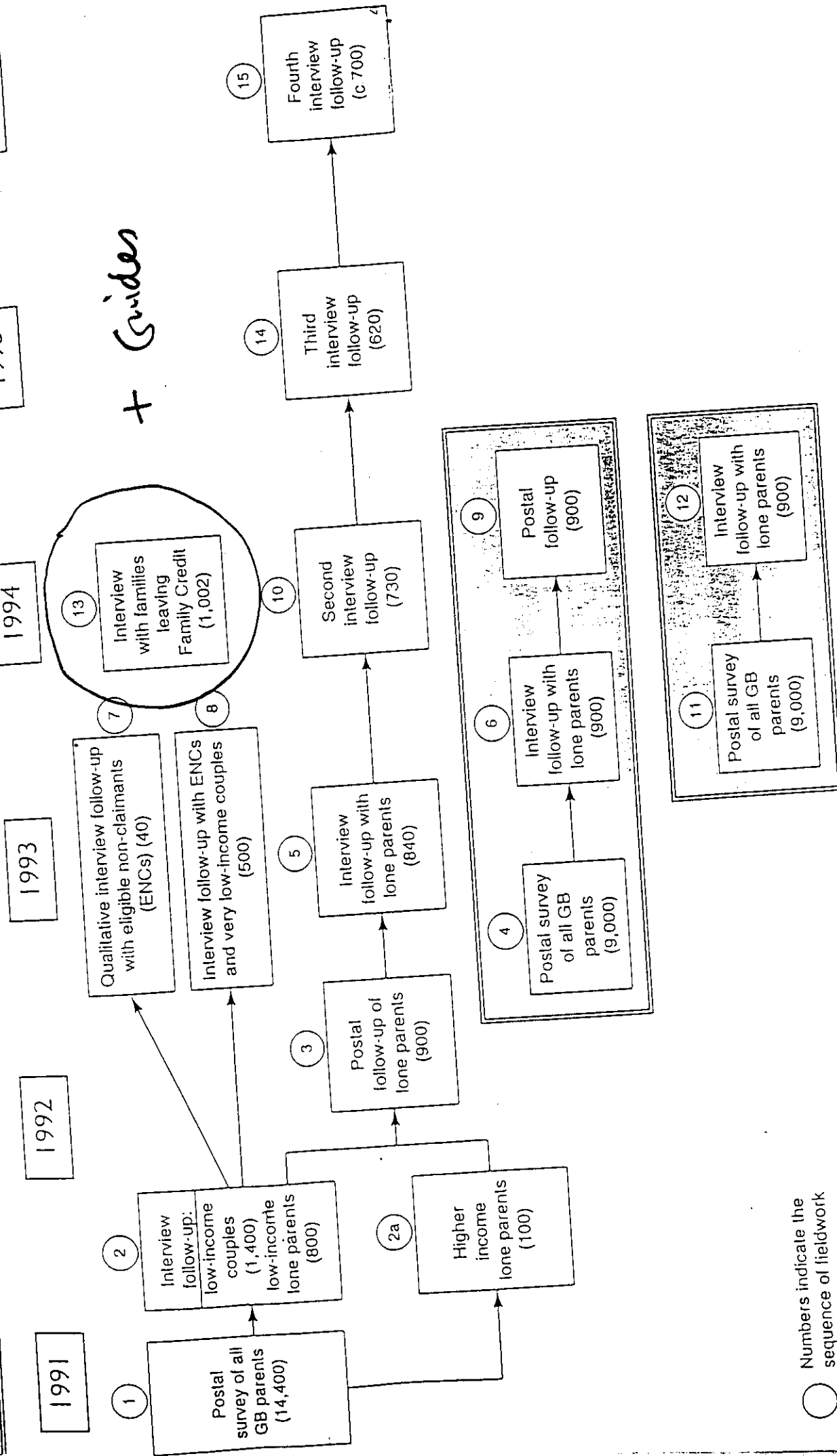

- Details of current work by household member with number of hours worked, plus salary wage etc.
- Economic status.
- Whether eligible non-recipient of income-related benefits.
