Codebook for the Combined Dataset

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A Guide to the Documentation

Following the introduction of various new forms of devolution, survey-based research on national identity and attitudes towards the political system was conducted in each of the four component territories of the United Kingdom. This codebook documents a combined dataset from the four individual surveys.

The individual surveys

The platform in England is the *British Social Attitudes* survey; the survey was undertaken by the *National Centre for Social Research*. In total, 3287 people across Great Britain south of the Great Glen were interviewed for the survey in 2001. The combined dataset contains only those respondents interviewed in England (2761). Interviews, approximately an hour in length, were conducted face to face using computer assisted interviewing. Around 20 minutes worth of additional questions were administered by means of a supplementary self-completion questionnaire. The sample is drawn, using a stratified clustered random sampling procedure, from the Postcode Address File. Respondent selection within each household is undertaken using a computer generated random selection procedure. Three versions of the survey are conducted each year (Versions A, B and C). The codebook indicates if a question has not been included in all three versions.

In Scotland, the platform is the *Scottish Social Attitudes Survey*. This survey was launched by the *National Centre for Social Research, Scotland* with a view to creating in Scotland a survey that could perform the same role as the *British Social Attitudes* survey already does for Great Britain as a whole. In 2001, a total of 1605 people were interviewed face-to-face using a single version questionnaire. A supplementary self-completion questionnaire was also used. Other technical details of the survey are identical to those of the British survey.

In Wales, the *Wales Life and Times Study (Welsh Election Study)* is used. This survey was conducted face to face with 1085 individuals using computer assisted interviewing. Fieldwork was conducted by the *National Centre for Social Research*. The sample was drawn using the Postcode Address File.

For Northern Ireland, the *Northern Ireland Life and Times* survey is used. This annual survey is a successor to the *Northern Ireland Social Attitudes* survey that took place between 1989 and 1996. In 2001, it was conducted face to face with 1800 respondents using computer assisted interviewing. It draws a random sample of addresses from the Postcode Address File and then uses the Rating Valuation Lists to sift out non-residential addresses. The fieldwork was undertaken by *Research and Evaluation Services*. The relatively large sample is necessary because analyses commonly have to be conducted separately for Protestants and Catholics.

The format of the codebook

The codebook is not constructed in question number order, but is divided into sections according to the subject matter of the questions. The responses given here convey the sense of the responses accurately, but the four surveys use slightly different wording in their responses. For the exact wording of responses, consult the BLAISE documentation.

For each question the variable name, the question wording, the question number and the responses are given. It is indicated where question wording differed in the original surveys. The following abbreviations are used:

Weighting

The marginals given are unweighted. For analysis, all data must be weighted to take account of unequal selection probabilities. The file is not preweighted. You should therefore impose the weighting with the following SPSS command:

WEIGHT by WTFCTOR

(or similar, depending on the exact syntax of your version of SPSS).
