to : Users of data for the National Child Development Study, Second and Third Follow-ups

Information from the study is requested by specifying a list of computer item numbers from the NCDS I coding frame, covering Sweep I (1965) and selected Perinatal data on the 1958 Cohort, the NCDS II coding frame covering Sweep 2 (1969/70) and the NCDS III coding frame covering Sweep 3 (1973/74).

The data subset is supplied in the form of fixed-length card-image records on magnetic tape with a line-printer layout of the items and their location in the record. The missing data codes have been standardised with the fields being filled with 8's for DNA (Does Not Apply) and 9's for NA (Not Answered). Should a variable take either of these values as defined in the coding frame then the output field width will be increased by one to avoid ambiguity.

There are three item numbers which have significant decimal places and which may not be re-computed from existing item numbers:

339 - Head Circumference to nearest 0.5 inch

1860 - Mean Terminal Unit length (from Test Booklet at NCDS II)


1953 - Weight (in Underclothes) in kgms.

If any of these items are requested, the original value of the item will be multiplied by the appropriate power of ten in order to produce an integer number, prior to being written to tape. The item should therefore be read using a field specification which allows for the corresponding number of decimal places.

There are also five items which have significant decimal digits, but which may be re-computed from existing item numbers and for these only the integer part is transferred. Users interested in these item numbers should therefore include the component items in their subset. The relevant item numbers are as follows:

Introductory Notes

First of all may we take this chance to thank you for carrying out these interviews on behalf of the National Child Development Study.

During the first few months of this year some 16,000 such interviews will be taking place. During the same pecied the young people themselves will be answering a questionneire, completing a few tests of their educationed attainment and they will be given a full medical examination. We shall also ask their teachers and hardisections about the young people's achools and their educational progress.

If you helped us with earlier follow-ups of these young people, you will know that this is the fourth time that information has been collected.

At birth, information was obtained which cast light on such matters as perinatal mortality, the significance of birthweight, the effect of mothers' smoking in pregnancy and many other important details with consequent improvement in the Maternity Services.

The findings of the follow-up when the children were aged seven have recently been published in From Birth to Seven (Davie, Butler & Goldstein, 1972). The overwhelming co-operation received from health visiters, teachers, medical officers, parents and many others enabled this report to present more findings which have been recognised as having important implications for policy and planning decisions for future medical, educational and social services.

A similar follow-up was carried out at 11 years of age and many of the results from this are now being published. A full list of all NCDS books, articles and papers can be obtained from the National Children's Bureau.

Now that the young people in the study are 16 years of age, the opportunity is being taken to extend the study as they reach school leaving age.

The interview

Ideally the interview should be with the child's mother or mother-figure by herself (apart from those few cases where there is none). However, this cannot always be possible and it is important to avoid

embarrassment and awkwardness that might be caused by asking someone else to leave.

In our preparatory work on the interview form, we have tried to avoid questions which would be resented by the person being interviewed for being too personal. However, it is always possible that people do not went to answer some questions for reasons of this kind. Please stress at the start of the interview that people are free to decline to answer some questions if they choose and do not press for answers where this is the case.

Recording information

The form is designed so that, as far as possible, information can be recorded with the minimum of difficulty and the processing and analysis of the answers can be carried out conveniently. You will find that answers fall into three categories:

Firstly, there are those that require a short, written answer and space is provided to write a few words.

Secondly, there are those questions where a number of alternative answers are offered, each with a number by it. In this case, you should ring the number corresponding to the answer you are given. You will also often find that there is a space provided to be used when the answer does not fall into any of the categories offered. For example:

It is recognised that the examinee is no longer a 'child' so every effort has been made to indicate our awareness that the 1958 cohort is fast attaining adult responsibility. Nevertheless, the weed 'child' creeps in occasionally but it is not intended it should be used to either parent or pupil.

It is known that few mothers attend school-leaving medical examinations but, nevertheless, we hope for a higher attendance on this occasion.

The Examination

The Medical Examination consists basically of a personal and detailed short medical history (Sections 1 & 2), information for which will be needed from pupil, perent when present, and from all medical records which are available to you (10Mi, etc.). Apart from Sections 1 & 2, it should be noted that questions \$(h) and 6(a) and 16(a) may also require information from child or perent. There is also a general medical examination (Section 3). For some of this equipment will be needed as listed below.

Questions are usually answered either by ringing the appropriate number alongside the correct answer or by willing a few words in a space provided.





TEST BOOKLET

For each study child in your school you should have received the following three documents

(1) An Educational Questionnaire

This is for completion by the headteacher and/or study child's class-teacher.

(11) An Individual Questionnaire

(111) A Test Booklet (attached)

These last two are to be completed by each study child. As they will be given to some 16,000 pupils attending many different secondary schools it is important that the instructions for administering them are followed as closely as possible.

- Where possible the individual questionnaire should be administered in one session and the test booklet in another - preferably during the mornings of two consecutive days
- 2) The number of study children in a school will vary from one to perhaps twelve or more, all of whom can complete the questionnaire and test booklet at the same time
- 3) The forms should be completed in a room in which only the study children and a member of staff are present and, if possible, without any interruptions

Detailed Instructions for the Individual Questionnaire

The piloting of these questionnaires has demonstrated the importance of pupils being confident that their answers will not be seen by members of staff or other pupils in the school. Please stress the confidentiality at the outset and point out to pupils that they will, after completion, be placing the questionnaires in an envelope and sealing it themselves.

Help in completing the questionnaire may be given to pupils experiencing difficulty, but please avoid guiding them towards a particular answer

For the average pupil the questionnaire will take about an hour to complete, but there will obviously be considerable variation

Before pupils complete the questionnaire please ensure that they have filled in all the details on the cover and have read and understood the instructions over the page

When they have completed the questionnaire, please remind them to place it in the envelope provided, seal it and write their name on the back of the envelope, before handing it to the member of staff present

Detailed Instructions for the Test Booklet

These instructions should be read through carefully before the testing begins and the teacher should make him/herself thoroughly familiar with the tests and the method of administering them before starting to give the first test.

There are two tests to be given: a Reading Comprehension Test and a Mathematics Test. These should be given in one session (the actual testing takes 55 minutes to which should be added a few minutes for the giving of instructions, etc.), but preferably on a separate occasion to the completion of the Individual Questionnaire.

The testing should preferably be carried out by a teacher who knows the child, and the atmosphere should be friendly and informal. Each pupil should have two sharpened pencils, but no other instruments.

Time limits must be observed exactly. A watch with a second hand should be used. If a stop-watch is used, care should be taken that it has recently been tested against an ordinary watch to ensure its accuracy.

After distributing the test booklets please ensure that the details on the front cover have been entered accurately, then ask the pupils to turn the page and read through the instructions to Test 1. Further explanation can be given where necessary.

Now say to the pupil:

"Now go through the sentences and put a line under the right word in each one. If you are not quite sure of an answer, underline the word which you think is most likely to be right. Work as quickly and carefully as possible. Carry on until you come to where it says, 'End of Test'. You will have 10 minutes. If you finish before this, look over your work until the time is up. Now begin."

Note the time when "Begin" is said, and what the time will be 10 minutes later. Give no help once the test has been started.

At the end of exactly 10 minutes, say:

"Stop writing and put down your pencils!"

Now ask them to turn the page and read the instructions to Test 2, the Mathematics Test. Again give any further explanation if necessary, then say:

"This is a test to see how well you can answer different kinds of mathematical questions. You will have 45 minutes to try them, enough time to attempt nearly all the questions if you try hard. Right. Begin."

Note the time when "Begin" is said, and what the time will be 45 minutes later. Give no help once the test has been started.

At the end of exactly 45 minutes, say:

"Stop working, put down your pencils and close your booklets."

And collect the booklets.




