I.1 Background

The numbers of people living in the household over time from pregnancy to age 4 are presented in this file. Such information is important for the following reasons:

- (a) It allows the identification of single parents.
- (b) It provides data with which to calculate a crowding index using the number of rooms from Group III.
- (c) The longitudinal data provide information for assessing the ways in which households change over the early years of a child's life.
- (d) Information on each parent's own childhood is useful in identifying different household circumstances (e.g. stepfamilies, single parent, family size) at various stages of their childhood and adolescence.
- (e) The no. of siblings in the household is a useful parameter indicating risk of an infection being brought into the home.
- (f) Paternal report was also obtained in pregnancy, allowing a comparison between the backgrounds of both parents

As far as possible the structure of the questions was chosen to provide information that could be compared with the 1958 and 1970 national birth cohorts. Additional questions and/or changes were at the request of collaborators.

The structure of this documentation is as follows:

- The actual questions are given verbatim in italics
- The coding instructions for the initial keying process are given in square brackets
- The actual questionnaire used is denoted by a capital letter, and the number of the question within that questionnaire is in round brackets
- The actual frequencies are given in tables, together with the relevant variable number
- A list of all the variables in this file are given in section I.7; where there has been further coding to preserve the confidentiality of the participants, this is noted here in square brackets. The variable numbers are denoted by one or more letters (denoting the questionnaire) followed by a number.
- Further details of the structure of the survey are given in the ALSPAC main documentation file.

1. There are changes in household composition over the time period. Does this indicate erroneous data or is there a good explanation? How much might be explained by the study mother living with her parents, in a home for pregnant teenagers or a hostel for the homeless?
2. What in this file distinguishes the participants who dropped out of the study after pregnancy?
3. How do the partners responses agree with those of the study mother in regard to the length of time they have been together and the biological relationships with the children?
4. Do women who were only children tend to choose partners with the same background more often than one would expect? Conversely do those from large families tend to choose those from large families?
5. How did the people in the mother's childhood household change over time? Was this pattern different for different socioeconomic groups, ethnic minorities or maternal ages?
