Data set: All mothers enrolled in the study during pregnancy or shortly after delivery regardless of outcome (n = 14541).

II.1 Background

Although it is popular to use geographic information systems (GIS) linked to census data to categorise the area in which an individual lives in terms of the proportion unemployed, owning a car, single parents etc., the individual's own assessment of the neighbourhood provides a different perspective.

ALSPAC aimed to collect information concerning the parents' satisfaction with the neighbourhood, their perception of its attributes, as well as the ways in which they interacted with their neighbours. The questions largely used those from the major national cohort studies, particularly the 1970 Birth Cohort. At the request of the UK Home Office the study used victimisation questions that had been in the 16 year follow up of the 1970 British Cohort [http://www.esds.ac.uk/longitudinal/access/bcs70/133229.asp].
