

## About the survey

- The survey was carried out in May 2012,
- Just under 3,000 members of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Evangelicals Research Panel were invited to take part.
- We also used an open web link allowing 267 new respondents to join the panel directly.
- 1,237 people responded. (a response of 42% which included nearly 70% of the people who had taken part in our previous survey on “The World on our Doorstep?”)
- There were more men (54%) than women (46%)
- 43% were over 55 and 16% under 35
- A wide spread of denominations were represented .
- A concentration of respondents in London and South East England.
- 93% described themselves as evangelicals. Only 1.7% rejected the label ‘evangelical’ but 5.2% were not sure.

Because we are using an opportunity sample of self-selecting volunteers, we cannot say that these findings are fully representative of the whole population of evangelical Christians in the UK. We can hope however, that it does paint a fair picture of keen and committed evangelicals, the kind of people who are likely to be influential in their local churches and communities.
