Welcome

Thank you for taking part in the 21st Century Evangelicals online research.

These surveys are designed by the Evangelical Alliance working with a group of other Christian organisations – our research club partners.

This quarter's survey is about politics – how you are involved, what you think of politicians, the issues that concern you and the way the Bible and your Christian faith influence your thinking in this area.

A report from this survey will be published in early 2015. The findings will also be used in the preparation of materials to help Christians engage in the general election in May 2015, including briefings for hustings events.

All answers are anonymous. If you'd really rather not answer a particular question you can always leave it blank. People vary, but we estimate the survey shouldn't take longer than about 20 minutes, unless you choose to write a lot in open-ended comment boxes.
