Explanators note

It would be normal, and desirable, in a publication like this to reprint a facsimile of the questionnaire used in the field. Unfortunately, the questionnaires available were rather faintly printed and in any case the print on some pages spread over too great an area to guarantee reproduction within the page format required for this paper. Accordingly that follows is a mixture of retyping and a guide to contents of pages whose format was simple repetition of the basic semantic differential scales. Some pages of the original had been photo-reduced and one page is reproduced here in facsimile as an example.

The data from the survey have been deposited at the SSRC Survey Archive at Essex University. They are available either as raw data in card-image format or as a system file generated by SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) consisting of four sub-files, one for each constituency. The data are on restricted access for two years. Those interested in secondary analysis of the data should write to either:


